Preparation

- 1. <u>Each student</u> prepares one's own ideas for the theme "Let's introduce organizations that are trying to solve global and social problems in your country!" in advance.
 - Research organizations in your country that are working to solve social and global issues.
 - Research organizations that you would like students from other countries to know about.
 - There are no particular restrictions on the field of activity of the organization.
 - There can be any number of organizations you wish to introduce.
- 2. <u>Each group (country)</u> discuss the theme and <u>select 2 excellent organizations</u> to present at the conference. (Pre-training)
 - Collect all ideas <u>from each student</u> at the beginning.
 - Discuss the theme among students, and select <u>2 organizations</u>.
 - Research the organization again to know more about the details.
 - Prepare documents for presentation.
 - Photos or drawings or diagrams or videos will be added to the document.
 - Save data as Google Slide or Powerpoint.
 - Screen sharing mode will be used.
 - Presentation should be less than 5 minutes all together.
 - <u>Phrases should be simple and short</u> so that translation will be easier.
 - Consider <u>time for translation</u>.
- 3. Each group (country) prepares documents to introduce their area and school.
 - Introduction documents <u>will be shared in advance</u> to save the conference time.
 - Introduce your area and school with photos and diagrams.
 - Presentation at the conference should be <u>less than 5 pages</u>.
- 4. Each group (country) prepare cultural introduction
 - Discuss which cultural performance will be made, and who will perform it.
 - The person in charge will make the necessary preparations.

- 5. <u>Presenters'</u> selection.
 - Presenters of <u>school introduction</u>: a few students.
 - Presenters of <u>cultural introduction</u>.
 - Presenters of <u>the theme</u>: a few students.

Conference Rules

- 1. All participating students are expected to <u>ask questions or express opinions</u>.
- 2. <u>Do not criticize other's ideas or opinions</u> by your own standards. Consider the variety of histories, cultures, behaviors, events, etc. *Constructive questions or opinions are welcome.
