Purpose

Students will share wisdom and ideas about familiar issues that we ourselves are currently concerned about regarding this planet we live on.

In addition, by listening to and discussing opinions with students from other countries, it allows them to realize the differences and similarities among themselves. It will promote solidarity of the same generation around the world. Furthermore, through these activities, we encourage the development of leaders, including participation as volunteer staff.

Conference Theme

"How can I solve this problem? Please share your wisdom!"

(Let's share ideas about Earth-friendly things that each of us are concerned about.)

Participants

High school students from all over the world.

*Student age: basically 15 - 18 years old.

*Participants will be less than 5 from each country.

*Total number: approx. 30 participants.

Group meeting

- 1. **Period**: September 4 24
- 2. Method: LINE Open Chat
- 3. Grouping: Participants will be divided into <u>3 groups</u>, and discuss and interact in chat.
- 4. **Leaders**: A leader for each group will be selected. The leader will be the facilitator of the group. They will also participate in the weekly leaders' meeting. (Leaders will be selected on the first day (September 4). *Assistant leader will be an organizing staff.

5. Schedule:

- Week 1: Promote mutual interaction through self-introductions, community introductions, school introductions, etc.
- Weeks 2 & 3: Participants will discuss their own concerns, questions, and issues regarding "earth-friendly things", and seek everyone's opinions and ideas.

Example: I live in a school dormitory. Due to Coronavirus, meals have been changed from buffet style to bento (lunch box). Therefore, a lot of plastic is used every day. Do you have any good ideas for reducing this plastic?

6. **Language**: In LINE Open Chat, write in your <u>own language</u>. Then, each person will use a translation tool to understand it in his/her own language.

(Multiple languages and scripts will be posted in LINE Open Chat.)

7. **Supplement**: Group opinions or proposals won't be selected. Individual opinions and ideas will be expressed at the conference.

Application Process

- 1. Application period: August 1 September 3
- 2. Qualifications for Applicants:
 - Applicant is a high school student (or equivalent) *15-18 years old
 - Active participation in the conference is needed.
 - Applicant will be able to participate in both the LINE Open Chat and the main conference.
 - For each language group, one English-speaking participant is need. (As a translator for that language.)
 - English proficiency is <u>not expected</u> for all applicants.
 - <u>Permission of a parent/guardian</u> is needed.
- 3. **How to apply**: Open the Google Form using the QR code in this document or the link on the official website, fill in the required



information, and submit it.

Preparation

- 1. <u>Organize your own concerns about Earth-friendly issues</u> (environmental problems, etc.) and prepare to share at the group meetings.
- 2. Prepare photos, diagrams, etc. in advance, so that they can be easily explained in the group meetings.
- 3. Prepare translation software. <u>Multilingual support</u> is required. (Google Translate, Bing Translate, DeepL, etc.)

Conference Rules

- 1. All participating students are expected to <u>ask questions or express opinions</u>.
- 2. <u>Do not criticize other's ideas or opinions</u> by your own standards. Consider the variety of histories, cultures, social systems, etc. Constructive questions or opinions are welcome.
