Conference style

- <u>Video call system</u> between 4 places (countries).
- Basically an open conference for the public. (Could be closed to the public if needed.)

Activity

Students discuss the theme "**Towards World Peace**" with 2 questions on video call. Through the exchange of opinions and ideas, students will develop their understanding towards world peace.

Aims

- 1. Develop students' understanding of the world.
- 2. Develop children's worldwide network.
- 3. Develop students' communication skills.
- 4. Provide opportunities for English communication.
- 5. Develop students' leadership skills.

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Preparation

1. <u>Every student</u> should prepare one's own answers to the <u>2 questions</u> on the worksheet according to the main theme **"Towards World Peace"** in advance.

- Q1: Why do we need world peace? Q2: How do we develop world peace?
- Answers (opinions and ideas) should be <u>clear and concrete</u>.
- They can prepare it in their own language.
- Use short sentences so that it can be easily translated into English.
- 2. <u>Each group (country) selects one opinion</u> among all different opinions to share with other countries.
 - Each side (country) can present <u>one opinion</u> as a group at the conference.
 - Discuss together in advance and select <u>one opinion</u>.
 - Prepare presentation of the opinion using photos and diagrams.
 - Use simple words in short sentences for easy translation into English. To be easily understood by students in other countries.
- 3. <u>Each group (country)</u> prepares documents to introduce their own school.
 - Introduce your school with photos and diagrams.
 - Use <u>5 panels or less</u> (*of A3 card for example*) to save time.
 - Use simple words in short sentences for easy translation into English. To be easily understood by students in other countries.
- 4. <u>Leader(s)</u> selection. *student(s)
 - The leader(s) will assist controlling the conference.
 - The leader(s) do not have to speak English. (Translator will help).
- 5. <u>Translator(s)</u> selection. *Student(s) if possible.
 - Students can take a role of a translator.
- 6. <u>Presenters</u> of school introduction selection.
 - Number of students will be decided according to the topic.
- 7. <u>Presenters</u> of "Why do we need world peace?" selection.
 - Number of students will be decided according to the topic.
- 8. <u>Presenters</u> of "How do we develop world peace?" selection.
 - Number of students will be decided according to the topic.

Conference Rules

- 1. All groups should ask questions or express opinions.
- 2. <u>Do not criticize other group's ideas or opinions</u> by their own standards. Constructive questions or opinions are welcomed.

Role list at the conference

- Translators: teachers or volunteers or students.
- Leaders: students at each group (country).
- Conference manager: The host who control the whole activity.
- Conference staff: Teachers and staff who manage the conference at each side (country).
- Notation: A staff member who will record of ideas and opinions on a white board so that students can refer to ideas and opinions during the activity at each side.
- Time keeper: A staff member who will assist in keeping to the time table.

Notes

- Please select students according to their ideas and will. <u>Students should not be selected</u> <u>according to their English skill.</u> The aim is not English conversation but to discuss and exchange ideas beyond country borders.
- Please give students enough time to find their own opinions and ideas, by allowing enough time to consider the themes in advance.
